2. Proposed contributions to **Work in Progress** (five minutes) should be notified to the Conference Director on arrival at the conference. Proposals for **Short Communications** (fifteen minutes) should be sent to the Conference Director by 1 July. A short communication offers an opportunity to present a new and important piece of evidence, or introduce a promising line of research, or make a significant revision of earlier assessments which may not justify treatment in a full-scale paper.

**Student Bursaries**

The Society offers up to five bursaries to contribute to the cost of attending the annual conference by full or part-time postgraduate students researching the post-Reformation Catholic history of England and Wales. The value of a bursary in 2010 is £100. A recipient is required to deliver a Short Communication (of some 2,000 words, taking no longer than fifteen minutes to deliver) on the subject under study. Written applications giving a brief outline of the topic, together with a supporting letter from the student's academic supervisor, should be sent to the Conference Director by 1 July.
